From the Deputy Principals

2022 has begun with a lot of promise for things to get back to normal. At the start of the year we were checking in and wearing masks, but both of these things have become optional. We now have a new meaning for the word 'RATS' and we have become quite good at testing ourselves for COVID-19. We are no longer having separate recesses and lunches and we can once again sit in our wonderful cafeteria. We still have to ensure we are social distancing of course and learning has been face to face since the beginning of the year. Seeing the cafeteria reopen, students attending excursions and work placement taking place makes us all forget the difficulties we all endured last year when we spent a lot of time in lockdown. As well, I would like to welcome all new students to the college and hope everyone's learning journey is full of many achievements.

Bankstown Senior College maintains its commitment to helping students in Year 10, 11 and 12 meet the minimum standard in literacy and numeracy in readiness for the online tests. So far this year, students have completed testing in the HSC Minimum Standard in literacy and numeracy and while some students achieved Level 3, many others will be persevering in their endeavour to achieve this before they finish Year 12. Through the College's commitment to explicit teaching of literacy strategies, the Literacy team has created several resources, including a Writing Booklet which aims to improve students' academic writing skills in preparation for the HSC.

COVID Intensive Learning Support Program (ILSP) was created last year to provide small group tuition for students who need it most across NSW primary, secondary and specialist schools due to the disruption to learning caused by the pandemic. At Bankstown Senior College, the ILSP was again placed into Stage 5 (Year 10) to help students improve their learning with support that focuses on core content and skills, particularly literacy and numeracy. All students from each Year 10 class will receive small group tutoring in reading, writing and numeracy throughout 2022. There may even be tutoring offered before and after school in various KLA subjects to assist all students with their learning.

I would like to acknowledge the ongoing work done by the IEC to College Transition Team which meets each term to discuss and support students that are exiting from the IEC to the College, with the main purpose being to see the College a more viable option for students. We will welcome a group of exiting IEC students into the College in Term 2.

Year 12 have completed their half yearly exams and this has been a very good opportunity for students to experience the exam process. Our new phone lockers have been used and hopefully will ensure the HSC phone rules are followed for all exams. I wish all year 12 students all the best in their first Year 12 exams.

I have been very impressed with the large number of Silver Awards that students have earned so far this year. These show how dedicated and hard working our students are as they strive for Gold.

Let's hope it will continue to be a better year here at Bankstown Senior College!

English/EALD Report

Term 1 has sped by and so much has been achieved in the English/EAL/D faculty. Year 12 have completed their Half Yearly exams and are mid-way through their HSC year. These important exams will be excellent preparation for the HSC exams in October. Success in these exams is dependent upon a lot of study, revision and hard work. Most students have realised that time management in exams is vitally important to achieving their best. Students are strongly encouraged to attend all English classes and discuss with their teacher any issues they may have concerning the work studied.

Preliminary students as well as Year 10 Additional English have experienced their first formal assessment task. It has been very pleasing to see how motivated and hard working the majority of students have been in preparing for all of the set tasks. Improvements you make through your effort will ensure better results later in Years 11 and 12, where the English course remains a mandatory and very important subject.

Students in EFS have also settled in their classes and are also improving. It is pleasing to see so many students eager to improve their English and pursue a successful education. We hope that through their hard work and the guidance of their teachers, they will progress quickly towards the acquisition of strong English skills.

While many students have Achieved a Level 3 in the HSC Minimum Standard test in Reading, this is not the case with the Writing exam. These students need to be typing up at least one piece of writing per week, and seeking feedback from their English or Literacy teacher. It is a concern that very few students are doing this regularly.

Refugee Student Support Report-RSS "WELCOME TO AUSTRALIA" AGAIN

During Term 1 2022 for 3 weeks, the three EFS 2 classes participated in the "Welcome to Australia" program run by MYAN (Multicultural Youth Affairs Network) NSW. On the second year of running, the program is welcome by staff and EFS students. Twice a week students engaged in workshops run by Youth Ambassadors of MYAN NSW and coordinated by Abdallah Altibi, an ex-student of the IEC Bankstown who is now the Multicultural Youth Worker in this notfor-profit organisation. Another ex-student ran some workshops, this time from the college, Ranya AL-ABBOOD. Ranya was a Year 12 student in 2020 and she is now studying at university.

The "Welcome to Australia" workshops ran twice weekly for three weeks. These workshops helped the EFS 2 students to increase their language skills, to become more aware of their culture and other cultures in Australia, to gain new knowledge and understanding of Australian culture/slang, to increase knowledge of Aboriginal history and to increase awareness of youth specific services and employment opportunities for young people. The program will conclude on 31 March but the EFS2 students wish it would be much longer because they have acquired very useful information about settling in Australia. The teachers have also commented how truly worthwhile this program is, especially because it is run by young people for young people.
